Record 5,701 Pounds of Food Donated at Wheels Annual Stuff a Bus Holiday Food Drive

LIVERMORE, Calif., December 8, 2015 – Tri-Valley residents were extremely generous in donating 5,701 pounds of food at the December 6th Wheels "Stuff a Bus" holiday food drive. The Livermore Amador Valley Transit Authority (LAVTA), operator of the Wheels bus system in the Tri-Valley, hosted its annual "Stuff-A-Bus" holiday food drive in support of the Open Heart Kitchen and Tri-Valley Haven Food Pantry. For the second year, Safeway Supermarkets hopped on board to host the holiday food drive at three of its Tri-Valley stores. Wheels bus drivers, LAVTA staff and other volunteers collected non-perishable food donations to help bring good cheer to families this holiday season. This year's collection was record-setting, with a 34% increase from last year's donations.

"We are very pleased at the outpouring of donations this year. It greatly helps those Tri-Valley residents in need of food, especially around holiday time," said Chair of the Board, Don Biddle.

Safeway donated 100 turkeys as their contribution in the food drive. They also provided twenty \$25 gift cards as prizes as part of radio station KKIQ live cast at the Livermore Safeway location. Participants there spun a prize wheel for the gift cards, Wheels bus passes and other donated items.
