#### 2. Wheels Fixed Route Bus Securements Demo

LAVTA staff showed a brief video of the Q-Straint's Q'POD wheelchair securement system's functionalities, after which MV Transportation staff gave a demo on how the Q'POD securement system works securing a scooter in one of the newly acquired Wheels 35-foot buses. Shawn Costello requested that MV reminder operators how to turn a chair's motor on or off should the passenger need assistance when disembarking the vehicle.

# 3. Citizens' Forum: An opportunity for members of the audience to comment on a subject not listed on the agenda (under state law, no action may be taken at this meeting)

Livermore resident Robert Allen stated that he will be 91-years old this month, and urged the committee to support his efforts in having LAVTA to establish a direct bus line between the LAVTA/Wheels office, Airway Park and Ride and BART. Mr. Allen talked about the East Contra Costa County BART extension called eBART and said that the Tri-Valley version could be called iBART for "interim BART". He provided a sample route map to LAVTA staff.

Jennifer Cullen introduced Robert Taylor, the new Executive Director of the Tri-Valley Senior Support Services.

# 4. Minutes of the November 2, 2016 and January 4, 2017 meetings of the Committee

November 2, 2016 minutes approved.

### 5. WAAC Recruitment

Staff opened the recruitment period for FY2018 WAAC membership for 2-year terms. The deadline for applications is April 17, 2017. The WAAC members discussed moving members around to different positions to allow for others to apply to the WAAC.

## **6.** LAVTA Upcoming Funding and Grants

Staff distributed the draft Paratransit Program Plan for FY 2018 for ACTC's Measure B and BB funds. The committee members' feedback about the submittal to staff is due on March 15<sup>th</sup>. Staff also informed the committee of applying for 5310 grant for Para-Taxi and mobility management. Staff explained some of the ideas for the mobility management funds, including a one-click website and modifying how the Para-Taxi program is administered.

## 7. Dial-A-Ride Passenger Satisfaction Survey

Staff gave an overview of the November 2016 Dial-A-Ride customer satisfaction phone survey results where 150 passengers were interviewed. The overall satisfaction was very high among all stages of the rider experience with average scores all above 4 on a 5-point scale. One area with a slight decline in the satisfaction was the reservations process. MTM will be conducting more training for the reservationists. The Chair requested that staff follow-up with the person who complained about the ride being too long to get more specific information. One WAAC member complimented MTM on modifying her pickup due to an 8-hour train delay.

# 8. PAPCO Report

Esther Waltz reported on the latest PAPCO and PAPCO/ParaTAC joint meetings. PAPCO members received updates on 2018 CIP, there was a presentation and discussion on the Countywide Needs Assessment study, they reviewed and approved the Funding Formula for Measure B and BB Transportation for Seniors and People with Disabilities and Implementation Guidelines and Performance Measures. Other WAAC members who were at the PAPCO meeting discussed a need for better hospital transportation for discharged patients, as well as the 211 program.

# 9. Dial-A-Ride Issues – Suggestions for Changes

The committee members did not report any Dial-A-Ride issues. The Vice Chair complimented MTM on having a local number on the caller ID. Staff updated the committee on fixed route service to the Alameda County Fair with dedicated hourly shuttle from BART to the fair.

Staff informed the committee on the upcoming open house for fixed route services in Dublin Library on March 7<sup>th</sup> and distributed flyers.

Staff also informed the committee on the upcoming individualized marketing campaign along the Santa Rita Road corridor. The Chair requested that staff look at whether the schedules have been posted at the Stoneridge/Santa Rita stops. Esther Waltz reported that there are some benches at the Rapid stops with metal bars removed. Staff said that the metals get stolen and they are aware of the situation.

Herb Hastings inquired about the new service plan for Route 14. Staff responded that LAVTA will break the Route 14 to Route 1 interline in June and Route 14 will get a new schedule.







## **Action Requested**

## **Background**

Included is a summary of the recommended fall 2017 Wheels bus service changes, which include both route and schedule adjustments.

### Discussion

The Comprehensive Operational Analysis (COA) study for the Wheels fixed-route service was completed last spring. The LAVTA Board of Directors adopted most of the recommendations from the study, which were in turn implemented in August 2016.

The COA-related changes were extensive, and affected both the route structure and overall geographical coverage of the Wheels service. Following the August changes, the agency has received continual input from riders and other stakeholders as to what seems to be working with the restructured service and what is not. Staff believes that the new route structure still needs to mature a bit more before conclusive post-implementation assessments are made – however, much of the customer feedback pertains to issues about connectivity/transfers, and some of those could be addressed within a shorter time frame. Areas of particular concern are:

- Not enough time to catch a bus after exiting BART, particularly during peak times when there are late-arriving BART Trains
- Lack of schedule coordination at the Transit Center
- Challenges with transfers between Wheels routes, especially on weekends when the service frequency is lower

Staff presented a draft list of potential service changes to the LAVTA Board at their April Board meeting, and the Board directed staff to publish the list of potential changes and to solicit public feedback. During the month of April, staff collected public feedback on the potential route and schedule changes. Staff solicited feedback by posting notices on the buses (English and Spanish), sent notices to Dublin High School and Foothill High School, posted on Nextdoor and Facebook, and posted notices at key locations throughout the service area. A total of 23 comments were received.

The following is the list of recommended changes presented to the Board for consideration and approval at their May 1<sup>st</sup> meeting:

### Route and Schedule Recommendations

Staff is planning to develop revised schedules on the majority of Wheels mainline bus routes that will be implemented this coming fall. These modifications would be cost-neutral. Nearly every Wheels fixed route will see a schedule adjustment in August 2017. This will allow for better connectivity between buses and BART.

<u>Route 14</u>: Staff is recommending a permanent modification to Route 14 as shown below:



The frequency of Route 14 would be modified to operate every 30/45 minutes during peak times on weekdays, and every 45/60 minutes midday/evenings. The weekend schedule would not change.

<u>Dublin High School Tripper Routes (501, 502, 504)</u>: Staff is recommending modification to the pickup location for routes 501, 502 and 504 to the school side of Village Parkway. Additionally, Route 501 is recommended to operate as an express route from Hacienda direct to Dublin High School.

<u>Foothill High School Tripper Route (602)</u>: Staff is recommending a slight extension of Route 602 in the AM only to respond to requests for service. No other changes are recommended.

Route 1: One additional route change to be implemented in fall 2017 is an adjustment of Route 1 to serve the new East County Hall of Justice (ECHOJ), which will open officially on July 1. The Route 1 service change was approved by the LAVTA Board in February 2017 and includes the extension of Route 1 into the ECHOJ and an increase in midday frequency to every 30-minutes all day.

During the WAAC meeting, staff will provide an oral update to the WAAC on the Board action taken at the May 1<sup>st</sup> meeting.

Finally, there will be presentations to both the LAVTA Board and the Pleasanton City Council.



This report is intended to provide the Committee with a summary and analysis of paratransit operations for the second quarter of FY2017 (October – December, 2016).




The graph below provides an overview of the historic paratransit ridership trend from the agency's inception thru the fiscal year FY2016:

## Annual Paratransit Ridership FY 1989-2016




The trend of decreasing ridership continues in the second quarter of the current fiscal year. The FY2017 Q2 the total number of passengers served on paratransit, which includes personal care attendants (PCAs) and companions, decreased by 5% from 14,469 to down to 13,759 when compared to the same three months the year prior. The number of trips during the same time period decreased by 10% from 14,332 to 12,841, as the two charts below illustrate. LAVTA pays the contractor on the per trip bases.





On-time performance (OTP) has remained high at 97% both in Q2, FY17 and F2, FY16. The OTP performance standard is 95%.
