Wheels Announces 4th of July Holiday Service Updates

LIVERMORE, Calif., June 29, 2015 – The Livermore Amador Valley Transit Authority (LAVTA), operator of the popular Wheels bus system, including the Tri-Valley Rapid, will be making changes to its bus service for the upcoming 4th of July holiday weekend.

On July 3rd, Wheels will be running a Sunday schedule for the observed holiday. There will be no Tri-Valley Rapid service on that day. Wheels Customer Service Center at the Downtown Transit Center will be closed. On July 4th, Wheels will be running a normal Saturday schedule.

On July 4th, Wheels will be detouring certain routes to accommodate the fireworks shows in both Livermore and Pleasanton. Routes 10 and 12 will be deviated for the Downtown Livermore 4th of July Fireworks from 6pm until 10:30pm. (See Attachment A for detailed route information.)

In addition, to better serve those going to the Downtown Livermore Fireworks, Wheels has added **two** additional bus trips on **Route 15** that leave the Downtown Transit Center at approximately **10pm** and **11pm**.

On July 4th, there will be major Wheels detours for the Alameda County Fair 4th of July Fireworks Show. (See Attachment B for detailed route information.)

About the Livermore Amador Valley Transit Authority



Attachment A Downtown Livermore 4th of July Bus Detours




ROUTES 10 AND 12 WILL BE DEVIATED AS ABOVE FOR THE LIVERMORE DOWNTOWN FIREWORKS ON THE 4TH OF JULY, from 6:00pm until 10:30pm.

Will turn from Railroad Avenue onto L St. to Chestnut going Eastbound to the Transit Center (Routes 10 & 12) and then from Transit Center (Route 10), left on First St., Right on Inman to 4th and then back on regular Route 10 schedule. Westbound 10 and 12 Routes will do the opposite for their routes going Westbound.

In addition, the Route 15 will have 2 additional trips added to its schedule with the last Route 15 bus leaving the Transit Center at 11:00pm.

RIDER ALERT FOR 4TH OF JULY FIREWORKS AT THE ALAMEDA COUNTY FAIRGOUNDS SERVICE FROM BART TO FAIR VIA HOPYARD, FAIR STREET, ROSE AND PLEASANTON AVENUE. ALL HOPYARD STOPS WILL BE SERVED. ALL OTHERS WILL BE AFFECTED DUE TO ROAD CLOSURES AND TRAFFIC CONGESTION, BEGINNING AT 12:00PM. BEST BET IS TO TAKE ROUTE 8 FROM BART TO THE FAIRGROUNDS. ROUTE 10 WILL BE RUNNING ON THE SANTA RITA CORRIDOR AND CAN STILL BE USED TO THE FAIR VIA PETERS BY THE VETERAN'S PARK.
