The committee members discussed the renaming and chose to replace the current name Wheels Accessible Advisory Committee (WAAC) with Tri-Valley Accessibility Advisory Committee (TAAC).

10. Dial-A-Ride Issues – Suggestions for Changes

Shawn Costello said he had issues with the day before automated phone call and Judy LaMarre added that she did not receive a ride reminder call.

Sue Tuite reported that today's driver was circling around her complex and that it takes long time for the reservations to pick up the phone. Herb Hastings added that the caller id on automated calls should be a local phone number, not 800.

Staff informed the committee on the Proposed Fare Policy Changes with the following highlights:

- o Begin on-bus sale of unlimited ride Day Passes at 25 cent discount off the cost of two cash fares (\$3.75 regular, \$1.75 senior/disabled)
- o Eliminate transfers
- o Eliminate 10-Ride tickets, except for paratransit

- o Offer a Youth fare of \$1.60 (must use Youth Clipper Card to qualify)
- o Increase Dial-a-Ride Paratransit fare from \$3.50 to \$3.75 in January 2019, then to \$4.00 in January 2020
- o Increase Senior/Disabled monthly pass from \$18 to \$22 in January 2019, then \$26 in January 2020, then \$30 in January 2021, so that it eventually becomes half the price of a regular monthly pass



Background

For 2018, Wheels ran a dedicated shuttle between BART and the Alameda County Fairgrounds (Route 52). This is a summary of ridership.

Discussion

The shuttle (Route 52) operated hourly during Fair times and did not operate when the Fair was closed. The dedicated shuttle itself carried a total of 2,941 boardings throughout its operation during the Fair. Combined with the additional riders on Route 10R, in total Wheels carried approximately 3,100 passenger trips to the Fair.

Signage was posted at BART and the Fair stops, ads were placed on radio station KKIQ and we also made social media posts. The Fair posted at sign at the BART Station directing passengers to the bus loading area.

In 2017, approximately 4,000 total trips were taken on the Wheels routes #10R and #52 (shuttle) to the Fair.

Residents of Pleasanton, Dublin or Livermore who are elderly, disabled or care for someone who is disabled may apply to be the representative for their city or county. Persons employed in the social services field in the Tri-Valley area may apply for the Social services position only.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Members are expected to represent the viewpoint of the elderly and disabled community of the Tri Valley and provide input on the Wheels services. Members also act as liaisons for Wheels by informing the general public about Wheels services and policies. Meetings are held every other month and are scheduled for ninety (90) minutes. For disabled members, transportation is provided on the Wheels Dial-A-Ride service for free both to and from the meeting. All members receive a pass which provides them with complimentary service on all Wheels fixed route buses while serving on the WAAC. Appointments to the WAAC are made by the elected officials who make up the Wheels Board of Directors.
